Dear Mr. President:

This letter is to report a violation of the Antideficiency Act, Department of the Army case number 05-19, as required by Title 31, United States Code, Section 1517(b).

The violation occurred in fiscal year 2004, when personnel at Fort Campbell, Kentucky used Operation and Maintenance, Army appropriation funds instead of Other Procurement, Army funds to purchase a Satellite Communication System and two Master Reference Terminals, including training and support. This purchase was a violation of Title 31, United States Code, Section 1301 (Purpose Statute). Since Other Procurement, Army appropriation funds were not continuously available from the date of obligation, a violation of Title 31, United States Code 1517(a) in the amount of \$2,072,291 occurred.

Enclosed is a report from the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army (Financial Operations). The following individual was named responsible for the violation.

101st Airborne Division and Fort Campbell, Kentucky


The Army determined that no disciplinary action should be taken against the responsible individual since he has retired. The Army concluded there was no knowing or willful violation of the Antideficiency Act by the individual named responsible.

The violation was corrected when the Army provided sufficient Other Procurement, Army appropriation funds to replace the Operation and Maintenance, Army funds.

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

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
