Dear Mr. President:

This letter is to report a violation of the Antideficiency Act as required by Title 31, United States Code, Section 1517(b).

The Antideficiency Act violation, case number 04-02 reports a violation totaling \$310,381, which occurred in fiscal years 1998 through 2000. The violation occurred when the Air Force Commander, 3245th Air Base Group (currently, 66th Air Base Wing), Electronic Systems Center (ESC), Hanscom Air Force Base (HAFB) Maine, executed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Massachusetts Port Authority (MASSPORT) to provide fire, crash, and rescue services for their adjacent airfield. HAFB used Air Force, Operation and Maintenance appropriation funds for these services. In turn, MASSPORT reimbursed HAFB for these services. The reimbursements should have been deposited in the Treasury Miscellaneous Receipt account. This resulted in a violation of Title 31, United States Code, Section 1517(a)(2).


Enclosed is a report from the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Air Force (Financial Operations). The following individual was named responsible for the violation.

Colonel (Retired) Peter G. Gavornik, Comptroller, Electronic Systems Center, Hanscom Air Force Base, Massachusetts

This individual would have received a Letter of Admonishment if he were still on active duty. The Air Force concluded there was no knowing or willful violation of the Antideficiency Act by the individuals named responsible. The Air Force corrected the violation with appropriate funding corrections. The Air Force also began depositing such funds to the Treasury, Miscellaneous Receipt account to prevent a reoccurrence of this type of violation.

Identical reports are being submitted to the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the Comptroller General of the United States.

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

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
