Dear Senator Fannin:

According to your August 22, 1974, request, and subsequent agreements with your office, we have obtained information on Federal programs which benefit American Indians (Indians, Eskimos, and Aleuts), including individuals, tribes, bands, groups, and businesses. For the 20 Federal departments and agencies included in our survey, we obtained information on (1) total agency obligations for each program which benefited American Indians for fiscal years 1969 through 1974, regardless of whether the program was designed exclusively for Indians, (2) the portion of such obligations made for the benefit of Indians, and (3) obligations for programs which were designed exclusively for Indians and which had Indian set-aside funds. When actual information was not available we asked agencies to provide us with an estimate.

For each agency which had programs designed exclusively for Indians and which had Indian set-aside funds, we also obtained information on (1) the total number of staff-years involved in program planning and the operation of each program, (2) the names of other Federal agencies which administered programs which were similar or which duplicated the agency's program, regardless of whether these programs were designed exclusively for Indians, (3) the agencies' procedures for coordinating their programs, and (4) congressional committees and subcommittees, other than appropriations committees, that were involved in program oversight.

The information contained in the appendixes was obtained through questionnaires. We did not verify the listing of the programs and the amounts being expended thereunder nor the source authority for such programs. Further, we did not assess the extent of duplication or overlapping between programs or the effectiveness of agency coordination.

During fiscal years 1969 through 1973, total obligations for Federal programs from which American Indians were eligible to benefit--regardless of whether the program was designed exclusively for Indians--increased each year from about \$31 billion in 1969 to about \$62.3 billion in 1973. However, in fiscal year 1974, obligations for these programs decreased by about \$2 billion to about \$60.3 billion. (See apps. I and II.) Portions of these obligations which benefited American Indians during this period increased from about \$0.71 billion to about \$1.5 billion. The Departments of the Interior and of Health, Education, and Welfare provided over 66 percent of these funds for fiscal years 1969 through 1974.

Thirteen Federal departments and agencies administered programs which were designed exclusively for American Indians and/or had Indian set-aside funds in fiscal year 1974. Obligations for these programs totaled about \$1.1 billion. Obligations for programs designed exclusively for American Indians were about \$0.95 billion and for programs with Indian set-aside funds were about \$0.17 billion. About 25,820 staff-years were involved in the operation and planning for these programs. (See app. III.)

Although some agencies identified similar programs administered by other Federal agencies and departments, several agencies stated that they were not aware of similar programs administered by other Federal agencies or that similar programs did not exist. Various methods of program coordination were described by agencies' identifying similar programs administered by other Federal agencies. For example, some agencies stated that programs were coordinated through written coordination policies, while other programs were coordinated through informal contacts, correspondence, and/or conferences. (See app. IV.)

In our recently issued report on "Improving Federally Assisted Business Development on Indian Reservations" (RED-75-371, June 27, 1975) (copy enclosed), we specifically identified coordination as being a problem with regard to economic development assistance. In that report we cited the need for a Federal leadership role in directing and coordinating Indian economic development and recommended that the Office of Management and Budget, along with appropriate Federal agencies, act to bring about the needed improvements.

The Senate and House Committees on Interior and Insular Affairs and Subcommittees on Indian Affairs were responsible for program oversight for most of the programs. However, we also identified several other committees, including the Senate and House Committees on Public Works and the Senate Committee on Labor and Public Welfare.

NOTES TO APPENDIX II

1. Agency estimates were used when actual information was not available.

2. Agriculture--Extension Service-State Cooperative Extension Services

Amounts shown as obligations for the benefit of American Indians represent Smith-Lever Act of 1914 funding available for Indian reservation programs in Arizona, Colorado, Florida, Idaho, Minnesota, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, North Carolina, North Dakota, Oregon, South Dakota, Utah, Washington, and Wyoming.

3. Civil Service Commission

Bureau of Retirement, Insurance, and Occupational Health Program obligations represent funds provided for program administration only, and does not include benefit payments.

Bureau of Training (total) amounts include funds programmed specifically for the National Indian Training Center.

4. Commerce

Totals for programs, except the Office of Minority Business Enterprise, exclude obligations for economic research.

5. Community Services Administration (formerly Office of Economic Opportunity)

Indian grant programs and Federal employees administering these programs were transferred to the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare in August 1973. Consequently, information for these programs is not provided.

6. Corps of Engineers (Department of the Army)

Amounts reported as civil works represent the civil functions of the Corps. These appropriations are used for construction and for operation and maintenance of water resources projects. Obligations shown are from projects which are used to mitigate the unfavorable effects these projects may have on Indians.

7. General Services Administration--Office of Administration, Office of Finance

The Indian Trust Accounting program is responsible for compliance with a Department of Justice request and an Office of Management and Budget directive to prepare accounting reports for cases pending before the Indian Claims Commission.

8. Health, Education, and Welfare

Total obligations for services and facilities included under Indian Health Service exclude reimbursements. Also information includes obligations for those programs which have been transferred to the Department from the Community Services Administration (formerly the Office of Economic Opportunity) in fiscal year 1974.

9. Housing and Urban Development

Accounts for programs identified under community planning and development, except Model Cities, are maintained on a reservation basis and amounts included represent net reservations. Reservation is the administrative set aside of program funds in accounting records for future obligation and has the effect of making the funds unavailable for other use.

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NOTES TO APPENDIX IV

1. Agency estimates were used when actual information was not available.

2. Agriculture--Indian land acquisition loan

The estimated minimal number of persons involved in the operations and planning for the program was 55. Agency was unable to separately identify people involved in planning as opposed to operations.

3. Commerce--Public Works impact

People involved in operations and planning for the program are the same as those identified in the Public Works program.

4. Health, Education, and Welfare, Office of Education--teachers for Indian children

The same three people are involved in both planning and operations for the program.

5. Interior, Bureau of Indian Affairs (BIA)--construction, road construction, and Alaska Native fund

BIA was unable to identify these positions under specific headings (program planning as opposed to program operations).

6. National Council on Indian Opportunity

The Council employees consisted of:

- 1 schedule C executive director,
- 6 career staff people,
- 8 Indians and/or Alaska Natives appointed by the President.

7. Treasury--State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972

Allocations to Indian tribes and Alaska Native villages represent a small portion (less than 1 per cent of the recipient governments) of the workload involved in administering the program. No specific individuals are assigned exclusively to matters related to Indians and Alaska Native villages; however, less than two staff-years are used for those purposes. In addition, other Federal agencies (the Bureau of the Census, Bureau of Indian Affairs and Office of Native American Programs) support the program.
