DIGEST:

Protest of the issuance of purchase orders to competitor for lease/purchase of photocopying machines is dismissed as moot where agency canceled purchase orders prior to delivery of equipment and no payment was made.

Saxon Business Products, Inc. (Saxon) has requested this Office to rule on the propriety of the issuance of three purchase orders by the Department of the Treasury's Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms, San Francisco, DLGB3U California, to Savin Corporation (Savin), for a "lease to ownership" type rental and purchase of Savin 770 DLGB3U8 copying machines. Saxon questions the authority used to purchase the copiers, with particular regard to the legality of obligating funds beyond the fiscal year, the propriety of issuing these purchase orders without competition, and the permissibility of going outside the Federal Supply Schedule to purchase equipment allegedly on the schedule. Saxon requests rescission of the purchase orders.

The Treasury Department has informed our Office that all three purchase orders were canceled; that delivery was not made prior to cancellation; and that no payment was made. Treasury has furnished our Office copies of the cancellation notices for each of the purchase orders at issue, and advises that it no longer intends to purchase these machines, but instead will rent this equipment under applicable Federal Supply Schedule contracts.

Since the relief requested by Saxon has in effect been provided, we consider the protest to be moot, and we shall take no further action on the matter.
