MATTER OF: Petralloy Corporation d/b/a Factech
Company**DIGEST:**

1. Protest against solicitation specifications is rendered academic by agency's cancellation of solicitation.
2. Protests against future sole-source resolicitation is dismissed as premature.

Petralloy Corporation d/b/a Factech Company (Petralloy) protested that the specifications in invitation for bids (IFB) No. DAAJ09-83-B-A487 (PPF) issued by the United States Army Troop Support and Aviation Materiel Readiness Command (Army) were unduly restrictive.

The Army canceled the IFB. Petralloy then protested any resolicitation on a sole-source basis.

The original protest against the IFB is academic because the Army canceled the IFB. International Alliance of Sports Officials, B-209846, April 13, 1983, 83-1 CPD 397.

The subsequent protest against a resolicitation is premature because the Army has advised us informally that it has no intention at this time to resolicit the procurement and has not prepared any resolicitation. Our Bid Protest Procedures are reserved for determining whether an award or proposed award complies with statutory, regulatory or other legal requirements, and are not available for challenging future procurements. Browning-Ferris Industries, B-209234, March 29, 1983, 83-1 CPD 323.

The protest is dismissed.
