Matter of: Alan Scott Industries, Inc.

File: B-223497

DIGEST

Protest that solicitation is unduly restrictive is dismissed as academic where the agency has canceled the solicitation.

DECISION

By protest filed with this Office on June 27, 1986, Alan Scott Industries (Scott) has protested as unduly restrictive Defense Logistics Agency (DLA) requisition No. YPM85331--025 for the procurement of tooth extracting forceps. DLA has advised us that the requisition in question was to be fulfilled through solicitation No. DLA120-86-QA580, dated January 17, 1986, which was canceled on June 12.^{1/}

Our Office will not consider a protest when the solicitation underlying it has been canceled since cancellation renders the protest academic. Hill Aviation Logistics, B-218824, May 16, 1985, 85-1 C.P.D. ¶ 560. Accordingly, we dismiss Scott's protest which was predicated upon the canceled solicitation.
