

DECISION

Shorrock Military Systems, Inc. requests reconsideration of our decision, Cardkey Sys., Inc., B-239433, Aug. 27, 1990, 90-2 CPD ¶ 159, in which we sustained a protest by Cardkey Systems, Inc. against the award of a contract to Shorrock under request for proposals (RFP) No. JLJMD-89-R-0042, issued by the Department of Justice for a security intrusion detection and access control system. Shorrock argues, as it did in the prior proceeding, that the protester knew or should have known that the agency did not intend to evaluate a feature termed "desirable" by the RFP and otherwise failed to show prejudice.

Under our Bid Protest Regulations, a party requesting reconsideration must show that our prior decision may contain either errors of fact or law or that the protester has information not previously considered that warrants reversal or modification of our decision. Sigma General Corp.--Recon., B-236870.2, Feb. 23, 1990, 90-1 CPD ¶ 210. The protester here essentially restates the arguments previously considered and expresses its disagreement with our findings, but has provided nothing that would warrant reversal or modification of our previous decision.

We deny the request for reconsideration.
