Matter of: Renic Government Systems, Inc.

DECISION

Renic Government Systems, Inc. requests reconsideration of our December 15, 1994, decision in which we dismissed its protest against the rejection of its offer submitted in response to request for proposals No. DU204-R-94-0068, issued by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). We dismissed the protest because we were advised by HUD that Renic was not eligible for award because, effective October 26, 1994, it became subject to HUD's Limited Denial of Participation (LDP).

We deny the request for reconsideration.

In its reconsideration request, Renic argues that the dismissal was inappropriate because the LDP took effect 1 month after Renic submitted its proposal. That fact is not dispositive, however. What matters is that the LDP is in effect for 12 months. That means that even if we were to sustain the protest, Renic would not receive the award because it is ineligible for an award from HUD until October 26, 1995, Renic therefore is not an interested party entitled to protest.

The request for reconsideration is denied.
