
R Dear Mr. Reuss:

Your letter of May 3, 1973, requested that we investigate (1) the accuracy and objectivity of the judgments made by the Defense Department to procure commercial trucks in Australia for use in Cambodia, and (2) the Postal Service's justification for leasing foreign-made vehicles. In our letter of May 17, 1973, we informed you that we would furnish you with separate reports. This report deals with the leasing of foreign-made vehicles by the Postal Service.

We subsequently agreed to include information in our report on the Service's (1) program for leasing employees' vehicles, including a statement as to whether the employees can use their vehicles for personal reasons, and (2) justification for commercially leasing foreign-made vehicles in Florida. We agreed also to visit the Miami and Hollywood Post Offices in Florida because they had the most commercially leased foreign-made vehicles.

As of April 27, 1973, the Postal Service was using about 38,000 leased vehicles nationwide to transport and deliver mail. It gave us the enclosed list which shows that 3,834 of these vehicles were foreign-made, of which 350 were leased from commercial firms and the remainder from postal employees.

The list also shows that the Miami and the Hollywood Post Offices had 125 and 51 commercially leased foreign-made vehicles, respectively. However, our review showed that Miami had 80 commercially leased foreign-made vehicles and Hollywood had 38. Postal Service officials informed us that the total number of foreign-made vehicles on the list was probably overstated because it was compiled manually from about 31,000 leases. Because of the limited number of commercially leased



vehicles, we did not believe that we should make a detailed and costly review of this many leases to obtain an accurate listing.

LEASING OF EMPLOYEE-OWNED VEHICLES

The Service permits post offices to lease employee-owned vehicles, using competitive bidding procedures, if Government-owned vehicles are not available to service delivery routes. The employee-owners generally use their vehicles to deliver mail and can use them for personal reasons at other times.

Under Postal Service procedures, only nonsupervisory postal employees may submit bids offering their vehicles for lease. A post office cannot lease more than two vehicles from an employee. This restriction applies to all postal employees, even those having financial interests in commercial firms offering vehicles for hire. Service officials told us that these restrictions were imposed to prevent improper conduct in awarding and administering leasing contracts.

JUSTIFICATION FOR COMMERCIALLY LEASING FOREIGN-MADE VEHICLES AT MIAMI AND HOLLYWOOD

Miami and Hollywood postal officials told us they leased vehicles because Government-owned vehicles were not available. The vehicles were needed to service park-and-loop routes--former foot and bicycle routes--and curbline delivery routes in new residential areas.

Postal Service procedures specify preference for bids offering American-made vehicles by adding, for evaluation purposes only, 6 percent to each bid offering a foreign-made vehicle. If a bid offering American-made vehicles is submitted by a small business firm or a firm in a labor surplus area, each bid offering a foreign-made vehicle is increased by 12 percent. If the evaluation of a bid offering a foreign-made vehicle and a bid offering an American-made vehicle results in both bids being equal, the lease is to be awarded to the bidder offering the American-made vehicle.

The lessors are required to fuel and maintain the vehicles during the lease period. Each lease is for 1 year with options to renew for three additional 1-year periods.

The 118 foreign-made leased vehicles at Miami and Holly-wood were obtained under three bid solicitations. These solicitations did not specify the type of vehicles required but stated that they must have approximately 65 cubic feet capacity--space needed to haul one tray of mail (about 400 mail deliveries) and 8 to 10 packages--and must pass State inspection.

^aIn addition to the 118 foreign-made vehicles, 112 American-made vehicles were leased under these solicitations.

All the leases under these solicitations were awarded to the lowest bidder in accordance with the bid evaluation procedures outlined above. A commercial leasing firm in Hollywood, which offered the foreign-made Datsun sedans and campers, was the successful bidder on all three solicitations for all the foreign-made vehicles currently leased by Miami and Hollywood.
