Request for Concurrence to Omita Clause From Subcontract

Dear Mrs. Harris:

This is in response to a letter from Julius B. Richmond, M.D., Assistant Secretary for Health and Surgeon General, dated June 4, 1980, requesting our concurrence with a proposed determination to omit the "Examination of Records by Comptroller General" clause from a subcontract to be awarded by the National Academy of Sciences to the Radiation Effects Research Foundation, Hiroshima, Japan.

The proposed subcontract covers epidemiologic studies of cancer among Japanese atomic bomb survivors and will cost approximately \$175,000 per year for a minimum of five years.

In accordance with 41 U.S.C. § 254(c) (1976) and Federal Procurement Regulations § 1-6.10, I concur in the determination for the term of the subcontract.
