Dear Mr. Laflamme:

Senator Kennedy has forwarded a letter from you dated April 20, 1981, regarding fire protection and prevention services at the Naval Training Center, Newport, Rhode Island, for our consideration. The Senator requested that we reply directly to you.

As you know, the General Accounting Office's involvement in this case has been limited to the receipt and docketing of a bid protest filed by RHK Services, Inc. under invitation for bids No. N62472-80-B-0433. The protest was filed on February 13, 1981; it was withdrawn on March 27, 1981. Our file was therefore closed on March 30, 1980, without any action on our part, i.e., we made no decision.

In any event, since this matter is presently in litigation as a result of a lawsuit brought by your union in the United States District Court for the District of Rhode Island, civil action no. 81-0254, this Office cannot offer any substantive comments on the issues you have raised.
