Dear Senator Proxmire:

This document responds to your request of September 25, 1985, that we review all Cabinet agency positions for which appointees require Senate confirmation. Specifically, you asked that we determine how many of these positions are "officially" vacant, whether individuals have been designated to fill the positions on an "acting" basis, how long they have served in that capacity, and whether nominations had been submitted to the Senate for the vacant positions. You also asked that we address the applicability of the Vacancies Act (5 U.S.C. 3345-3349) to the positions in each agency, particularly the provision of the act that places a 30-day limit on temporary appointments to positions that require Senate confirmation.

As agreed in meetings with a representative of your office, this document provides information on positions filled by temporary appointees or otherwise vacant as of January 1, 1986. As also agreed, separate reports will be issued on the applicability of Vacancies Act provisions to vacancies at the Departments of Health and Human Services, Education, and Labor.

We obtained information on all executive level and GS-16 to 18 positions requiring Senate confirmation from the personnel offices of each of the 13 cabinet departments. We obtained the title, pay grade, and name of the person occupying the position as of January 1, 1986. If the position was not occupied by a person confirmed by the Senate, we also ascertained when the last person confirmed for the position left. In addition, we asked if anyone had been nominated for any of the vacant positions.

Our findings for the 13 departments are contained in the appendixes. Appendix I is an overall summary of the findings. It shows that the 13 cabinet departments had 276 positions that required Senate confirmation. As of January 1, 1986, 229 were occupied by individuals confirmed by the Senate; 24 were occupied by individuals officially designated as acting, of whom 19 had been in an acting capacity more than 30 days; 22 were vacant (no one designated as acting) of which 18 had been vacant more than 30 days; and one position was occupied by a person appointed by the President while the Senate was in recess. Appendix II is a listing of the positions requiring Senate confirmation and the name of the persons occupying those positions as of January 1, 1986. Appendix III lists those positions not filled by persons confirmed by the Senate as of January 1, 1986, and provides information on the status of those positions as of April 15, 1986.

As of April 15, 1986, nominations had been submitted to the Senate for 25 of the 47 positions that were not occupied by confirmed persons as of January 1, 1986.

As arranged with your office, unless you publicly announce the contents of this document earlier, we plan no further distribution until 30 days from the date of this document.
