To the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives

On October 20, 1981, the President's second special message for fiscal year 1982 was transmitted to the Congress pursuant to the Impoundment Control Act of 1974. The special message proposes 59 deferrals of budget authority totalling \$147.0 million as follows:

Agency officials also told us that the amount listed in the special message as other budgetary resources (\$120,000) consists primarily of reimbursements by employees for meals and lodging. Since the \$120,000 is an annual estimate, only about \$16,000 would be received during the period under the Continuing Resolution.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES

The Office of Management and Budget released the \$10 million deferred in D82-43 on November 3, 1981. Agency officials also told us that the special message should have reflected total budgetary resources of \$188,208,500. That amount includes the funds appropriated under the Continuing Resolution (\$133,940,500). As of early November, the agency has obligated \$137,354,000.

D82-44 Office of Refugee Resettlement Cuban and Haitian Entrants Reception and Processing 75X0174

On November 6, 1981, the Office of Management and Budget released \$2.5 million of the deferred funds (\$4.9 million). Agency officials also told us that the special message should list total budgetary resources of \$33.030 million. That amount includes \$2.8 million available under the Continuing Resolution. The \$2.8 million represents 14 percent of the total amount appropriated for fiscal year 1982 under the Continuing Resolution (\$20 million), and under OMB Bulletin 82-1, is automatically apportioned without action by OMB. Agency officials told us that the \$2.8 million is available and is being obligated.

We have discovered that some funds appropriated to the Department of Health and Human Services, Cuban and Haitian Entrants, Domestic Assistance, account were not made available to the Department in fiscal year 1981, and continued to be reserved during fiscal year 1982 before this special message was reported. After an examination of this account, we conclude that a deferral message should have been transmitted to

the Congress in fiscal year 1981, and that such a message also was required at the beginning of fiscal year 1982.

Congress appropriated a total of \$190 million in no-year funds in fiscal year 1980 and 1981 to the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to provide assistance for resettlement of Cuban and Haitian entrants in the United States, based on provisions of the Refugee Education Assistance Act of 1980, Pub. L. No. 96-442. The appropriations are to be used to reimburse States for costs of cash assistance, medical assistance, assistance to unaccompanied minors, social services, and related administrative costs.

As of January 1981, \$137 million of the \$190 million had been appropriated by the Congress and apportioned by the Office of Management and Budget to HHS. The remaining \$53 million was appropriated on June 5, 1981, as part of the Supplemental Appropriations and Rescission Act, 1981. The agency requested an apportionment from OMB of the \$53 million on June 20, 1981. However, OMB did not apportion the funds; rather, it returned the apportionment request to HHS on July 9, 1981, with a request that HHS review its program plan and better explain how it planned to to use the funds.

On September 15, 1981, HHS resubmitted a request for apportionment. HHS asked that approximately \$16 million be apportioned and that approximately \$37 million be deferred. The deferral was to cover unobligated funds budgeted for assistance to unaccompanied minors (\$17 million), and for a contingency reserve (\$20 million). OMB approved this request on September 29, 1981. However, no special message reporting this deferral was submitted to the Congress until October 20, 1981, the date of this special message.

A deferral message should have been submitted to Congress before this special message was reported. When OMB failed to apportion the \$53 million provided in the June 5 appropriation and returned the apportionment request to HHS on July 9, 1981, a deferral message of \$53 million was required. A supplementary message adjusting the deferral to \$37 million should have been reported when OMB finally apportioned \$16 million on September 29, 1981.

Agency officials also estimate that out of the total \$153 million apportioned in fiscal year 1981, approximately \$10.5 million remained unobligated at the end of fiscal year 1981 and carried over into fiscal year 1982. The funds did not appear

on the original apportionment form because the carry-over amount was not known when funds were first apportioned for fiscal year 1982. The agency officials also told us that they recently requested OMB to reapportion the funds. A deferral message should be submitted if OMB does not reapportion the funds. In addition, the officials told us that \$9.9 million is available under the Continuing Resolution and is being obligated.
