Dear Mr. Hasley:

This is to acknowledge receipt of your letter to us of June 10, 1988.

As you know, the issue of progress payments made under contracts requiring first article testing continues to be a matter of concern to the government. We previously provided you with a copy of a proposed change to the Federal Acquisition Regulation that would provide express authority for a contracting officer to include in a solicitation a limit on the amount of progress payments that may be made prior to first article approval. Further, we understand that the Defense Acquisition Regulatory Council may be considering an additional change that would address the issue of unbalanced first article pricing.

We recognize that neither of these changes in procurement regulations would affect your dispute with the Army over its rejection 2 years ago of your bid to supply compasses to that agency. We also appreciate your deep conviction that you should have received the contract in that procurement. As we have stated previously, however, we have no grounds for legal objection to the Army's actions.
