Our staff at the Mayy Finance Center, Cleveland, has tested transactions in the accounts of your station for the 6 months ended June 1970 to evaluate the quality of disbursing. Using sampling techniques, to selected for review 336 of 2,027 regularly closed military pay records and 1,115 of 4,334 disbursement wouchers.

examined. These included 326 monetary errors totalin; \$4,031, 37 leave accounting errors for 275 days, and two errors in reporting taxable income. We estimate the unexamined records contain an additional 1,120 errors (933 monetary totaling \$13,656, 105 leave accounting for 1,377 days, and 10 tax reporting). Details are in the appendix. The more significant problem areas are highlighted below:

Military pay records

- -- Leveral different types of errors occurred in accounting for leave -- computing balances incorrectly, failing to charge leave used, charging leave on delay en route incorrectly, and crediting leave carned improperly. Thirteen of tuese errors also resulted in incorrect payment of leave rations.
- -- In 13 cases, commuted rations were not adjusted for perious of leave or temporary duty as required by paragraphs 30165 and 30167 of the MPP.
- -- Under and overpayments totaling fly? resulted from improper computations or extensions of entries on 10 pay records.

MILITARY TARKET PROMETERS

- -- In 23 cases involving temporary additional duty travel, per diem for days of departure from or arrival at Government installations was not reduced for meals available as required by paragraph Mi205-5, feetaste y/ of the JRR. For example, see voucher 24741.
- -- Eleven members were paid per dism totaling \$671 when they were in a mileage or leave status contrary to paragraphs MAGOL-1 and 3 of the STR (see womeners 24044 and 24625).
- -- Programming, incorrect distances were used to compute travel allowances or mileage entitlements. In 64 cases, distances were based on the wrong mode of transportation or were computed incorrectly. Paragraph M4155 of the JTR explains now to determine distances and conditions which govern the use of common carrier or nightay distances (see wonchers 24359 and 2507k).
- Wixteen members were not paid per dies while semiting separation as authorised by paragraphs MAIS7-le and MA205-5d of the FFH (see vouchers 25054 and 25109).

when departure or return was within 30 minutes of the end or beginning of the quarter. Such payments are unsuthorized unless supported by a statement justifying the time of departure or return as stated in paragraph Clolch-2a of the JTR (see voucher 24935).

We could not substantiate entitlements in several cases because of poor dominantation. Payments to five members, apparently returning from oversees to a separation center of choice (Brunswick) were not supported by complete itine varies and travel orders as required by MII paragraph 4000-16(7). Also, in at least 11 other cases, orders were not endorsed to show the availability of Government mass and quarters in accordance with MII paragraphs 3151-21 and 4001-9 (see vouchers 24285, 24291 and 25148).

In the last 3 years, chaits examiners performed limited reviews at your station and identified 265 erroneous payments totaling \$6,500.

In open of their reports, the emissions emphasized that disbursing office personnel were not making a thorough review of pay record entries. We agree with this observation.

Because our review was limited to records a silable at the Pinance Center, we could not pinpoist the causes of many exters or give recognition to improvements since June 1970. Movever, our findings indicate that disbursing personnel need to become more findings regul tions — particularly loave and travel. We suggest a careful review of LECHAY Leave Accounting Instruction 7220.63A of April 2, 1971, and the 1971 reisons of the Many Travel Instructions.

We are emploring information copies of our notices of exception and informal inquiries to ansist you in identifying courses of errors and in taking corrective actions. We would appropriate your comments on our observations along with advice of any actions taken. If you need additional details, places let us know.
