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Introduction

This publication is a description of various sources, including printed materials and computerized data base files, and how they can be used to identify GAO reports.

The U.S. General Accounting Office (GAO) is an independent nonpolitical agency in the legislative branch of the Government. It was established by the Budget and Accounting Act of 1921, and is under the direction of the Comptroller General of the United States. Since 1921, GAO's responsiblity and authority have been broadened by additional acts of the Congress.

Currently, GAO performs special audits, surveys, investigations, and evaluations of Federal programs. This work is either self-initiated or performed at the request of congressional committees or members. GAO's findings and recommendations are published as a "Report to the Congress," often referred to as GAO reports or GAO audit reports.

GAO has used several systems (A-Numbers, B-Numbers, division numbers, and I-Numbers) to identify its reports, decisions, etc. A-Numbers were numerical classifications for subject areas. From January 1924 through December 1938, A-Numbers (A-1 to A-99999) were assigned to subjects as they were established. A few subjects with A-Numbers were still active until November 1979.

B-Numbers were also numerical classifications for subject areas. The first B-Number, B-1, was assigned in December 1938. In November 1979, the new computerized correspondence control system in the Office of General Counsel made it necessary for the Index and Files Section to assign a unique B-Number to each new job.

Before fiscal year 1975, it was necessary to know the exact date a report was issued to obtain a copy, as A-Numbers and B-Numbers represented subjects and were not unique identifying numbers.

Beginning with fiscal year 1975, GAO began assigning a division number in conjunction with the A-Number or B-Number. The division number is unique to an individual report, and includes the acronym for the division which issued the report, the last two digits of the year in which the report was issued, and a sequentially assigned number. See example:

Acronym for Human Resources Division / Last 2 digits of year / Sequentially assigned number

/ / / HRD-77-78

Since fiscal year 1975, the division number is all that is required to obtain a copy of a report.

The Office of Investigations, abolished in fiscal year 1956, also issued various correspondence, including reports identified by I-Numbers (I-18170). I-Numbers were numerical classifications for subject areas and the exact date a report was issued is essential to obtain a copy of a specific I-Number report.

Assistance in identifying GAO reports can be obtained from the GAO Document Handling and Information Services Facility (DHISF) by calling (202) 275-6241. DHISF has developed a bibliographic data base which is used to generate and photocompose the GAO Documents journal. This data base can also be used for searching and retrieving information on documents published by the GAO. There are various access points in the data base. These include subject, agency/organization concerned, congressional relevance, GAO issue area, and budget functions. The data base includes information beginning with fiscal year 1977 (Oct. 1976) through the present date.

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GAO DOCUMENTS

GAO Documents is issued every month to help the GAO staff and the Members of Congress increase their awareness of and access to the many GAO information resources.

GAO Documents is a comprehensive record of current GAO publications and documents, including audit reports, staff studies, memoranda, opinions, speeches, testimonies, and Comptroller General decisions.

GAO Documents began publication with Vol. 1, No. 8, May 1977 issue. In October 1977, a CITATIONS BACKLOG ISSUE containing issues 1-7, (October 1976 through March 1977) was published. There is no printed hard-copy index to accompany this issue. Annual cumulated indexes of GAO Documents are issued, and are available only on microfiche.

How To Use GAO Documents

GAO Documents is organized into two sections: an INDEX SECTION (yellow pages) and a CITATION SECTION (white pages). The journal may be used for a variety of purposes, including in-depth research into a specific topic, search for a particular document, maintaining current awareness on a given topic, and general browsing.

The INDEX SECTION is currently composed of eight separate indexes, enabling the user to search for information via any one or combination of the following points:

-Subject Index

(Free indexing terms for Vols. 1 through 3; GAO Thesaurus terms beginning with Vol. 4)

-Agency/Organization Index

(Includes both Federal agencies and nongovernmental corporate bodies)

-Personal Name Index

(Includes names of individuals who are the subjects of the documents)

-Congressional Index

(Includes entries under relevant congressional committees/agencies, and individual Representatives and Senators to whom documents are addressed)

-Law/Authority Index
(Includes entries under Code of Federal Regulations,
Decisions of the Comptroller General, Executive Orders, Federal Procurement Regulations, Federal Register, Public Law Name, Public Law Number, other statutory as well as nonstatuatory authorities, U.S. Code,
and U.S. Statutes at Large references)

-GAO Issue Area Index

(Official GAO issue areas and approved priority lines-of-effort)

-GAO Division/Office Index

(Includes the GAO division/office that had prime responsibility for preparing a report, decision, opinion, etc., or for conducting the project or investigation about which the document is concerned)

-Budget Function Index

(Function categories by which Federal funds are appropriated and identified in the Federal budget document)

The following index was included in <u>GAO Documents</u>. It was published on microfiche for the backlog citation issue and for each monthly issue beginning with Vol. 1, No. 8, May 1977 and ending with Vol. 2, No. 6, April 1978:

-Document Number Index (The identifying numbers assigned by GAO divisions and offices to the documents they issue).

The CITATION SECTION consists of brief descriptions of the documents and often includes an informative abstract. Some or all of the following information is contained in each citation, as appropriate:

- -title/subtitle
- -Document numbers and report number
- -type, date, and pagination of the document
- -author/witness
- -GAO issue areas
- -agencies/organizations concerned
- -congressional committees/agencies/Members to whom the document is specifically relevant
- -law and/or related statuatory/regulatory authorities on which the document is based
- -GAO control (division/office) for additional information

Reference from index entries to the corresponding citations is provided by a unique six-digit accession number assigned to each citation. This accession number should also be used to request copies of the actual document described by the citation.

Public Issuance Of GAO Documents

GAO Documents, Vols. I thru 3, are restricted to "Internal GAO Use Only." Beginning with the issuance of Vol. 4,

GAO Documents is available to the general public through subscription from GPO. The basic format remains the same except there will be no reference to restricted or classified documents.

GAO Documents On-Line

When available, the <u>GAO Documents</u> on-line data base file will contain two separate files, one for restricted documents and the other for unrestricted. The <u>GAO Thesaurus</u> has been developed for use with the on-line system.

KWOC INDEX

United States. General Accounting Office. KWOC (Key Word Out of Context) Index. Washington: GAO, July 1973-

The KWOC Index is issued irregularly. Normally it is cumulated into a combined computer printout covering an entire fiscal year, although there have been indexes that covered portions of a fiscal year.

The KWOC Index uses all major words in the title of GAO audit reports as index terms. Each term used cites GAO audit report by complete title, and includes references to B-Number, (sometimes A-Number), date, budget function index, agency or agencies involved, issue area number, job assignment code, division number, and restricted, unrestricted or secret designation.

Besides the major words in the title, each element of the citation (except the restricted, unrestricted or secret designation), is also searchable. (Beginning in November 1979, a new or unique B-Number was assigned to every GAO report. Prior to this date, B-Numbers represented assigned subject areas.)

B-NUMBER

If the user knows the B-Number for the subject being researched, or finds in the KWOC Index a B-Number that appears to be appropriate, this element is searchable by turning to the "B" section of the Index. The B-Numbers, for the period covered by the Index, are grouped together numerically with a complete list of reports under that number.

DIVISION NUMBER (July 1974-

The division which issued a report is also searchable. Division numbers are entered by their alphanumeric number. (EXAMPLE: LCD-76-1 is listed in the "L" section of the Index, and then all LCD reports are listed by number).

DATE

At the end of the $\underline{KWOC\ Index}$, GAO audit reports are listed by the date they were issued. The specific date order is: year/month/day.

Agency Or Agencies Involved

Agency designations are normally in an abbreviated form within the citation and can also be abbreviated as the index term. (EXAMPLE: DHEW for Department of Health, Education, and Welfare; DN for Department of the Navy). A searcher looking for reports involving departments or agencies should check both the abbreviated and spelled-out forms.

Issue Areas Numbers

GAO work assignments normally fall within a specific numerically designated issue area. (EXAMPLE: 1900--Federal Procurement of Goods and Services.) A searcher could use the issue area number to locate GAO audit reports which were related very generally in subject content.

Budget Function Index

These are function categories by which Federal funds are appropriated and identified in the Federal budget document.

JAC (Job Assignment Code) (July 1975--)

This is a unique number assigned to individual jobs.

The $\underline{\mathsf{KWOC}}$ Index has several unique features not available in $\underline{\mathsf{GAO}}$ Documents. These include the ability to search $\underline{\mathsf{GAO}}$ reports by their title, issue date, and division numbers.

The $\underline{\mathsf{KWOC}}$ Index contains references to restricted GAO audit reports and is not available for researchers outside the General Accounting Office.

GAO NEWSLETTER

United States. General Accounting Office. GAO Newsletter. Washington: GAO, Vol. 1, No. 1, Feb. 1967-Vol. 6, No. 12, Jan. 1973.

The GAO Newsletter is issued monthly and contains references to GAO audit reports, selected Comptroller General decisions, speeches by GAO staff, and general news regarding staff changes, congressional testimony, public activities, etc.

Each issue contains all reports issued for the previous month and any missed from the month before. Selected GAO audit reports are listed under bold type captions containing an abbreviated form of the report title. An abstract of these reports is included as well as the B-Number. Reports not selected for abstracting are listed by title and B-Number only. The exact date a report is issued is not always given, but a user can determine the B-Number, the month, and the year a report was issued.

A user needs to know the approximate date a report was issued for this publication to be a useful tool.

There is no index to accompany the GAO Newsletter. Each issue must be scanned to determine what reports were issued.

This publication continues, in a slightly different format, as the Monthly List of GAO Reports.

MONTHLY LIST OF GAO REPORTS

United States. General Accounting Office. Monthly List of GAO Reports. Washington: GAO, Vol. 7, No. 1, Feb. 1973-

The Monthly List of GAO Reports continues the GAO Newsletter. The coverage was changed to include only GAO reports, legal decisions, and opinions. The legal decisions and opinions were also excluded beginning with Vol. 11, No. 2, the March 1977 issue.

Reports are listed by broad subject headings (e.g., agriculture, national defense, general government, etc.). Under the subject headings, reports are listed by title and include an abstract, a report number, and the date of the report. Letter reports do not have abstracts. The GAO Documents accession number has been included as part of the entry beginning with Vol. 13, No. 4, the May 1979 issue.

A user needs to know approximately when a report was issued for the Monthly List of GAO Reports to be a useful tool, as there are no cumulative issues or indexes to this publication.

GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE PUBLICATIONS

United States. General Accounting Office. General Accounting Office Publications. Washington: GAO, June 1973-Ref. GAO Z1221.A164.

General Accounting Office Publications is published semiannually, in June and December. It is a catalog of GAO publications, including unrestricted audit reports, congressional testimony by GAO officials, speeches by the Comptroller General, and various other publications including those of the Joint Financial Management Improvement Program (JFMIP). Addresses and phone numbers are given for offices within GAO where free publications may be obtained at the time of publication. Publications available from GPO have references to the GPO stock number and the prices in effect at the time of publication.

Prior to the December 1979 edition, each issue cumulated the previous issue, giving access to publications issued over a 1 year period (i.e., the June issue covered July-June, and the December issue covers January-December). Beginning with the December 1979 edition, the period covered by an issue was reduced to 6 months (i.e., January-June and July-December).

Audit reports are indexed under broad subject headings. Entries under a particular subject heading contain references to report title, report number, and date. Beginning with the June 1979 edition, the accession number from GAO Documents is also included. There is a subject index which lists all the subject headings and the page number on which their entries begin. The user needs to check each item listed under a subject heading to locate a specific report. References to related reports appearing in the same issue are noted, by item number, at the end of each subject heading. See examples below:

This index refers the user to item number, not to the subject heading, of the related report. Each item number must be checked when searching for a specific report.

This index pertains to unclassified and otherwise unrestricted reports issued by the Comptroller General to the Congress during calendar year 1959.

The index contains three parts:

Part I -- Topical index of findings

Part II --List of audit reports included in index with identifying numbers referred to in the topical index

Part III --List of contractors referred to in audit reports

The topical part of the index is primarily an index of findings rather than a complete index of all subjects contained in the reports. The emphasis on findings was adopted as they represent the main interest of GAO audit report users.

Findings are classified by main headings and appropriate subheadings. References are to specific reports and to the report pages which contain the findings. Each report is referred to by an identifying number. With this number, Part II of the index should be consulted to ascertain the name of the report.

then he would look at Part II(a) of the index to find that report number 34 referred to the report on Federal National Mortgage Association for 1958. By obtaining a copy of that report, he would find on page 30 a discussion of increased interest costs resulting from direct borrowing from the public by a Government agency.

The pattern of this index contemplates that Part II will be used to identify reports on specific departments and agencies of the Government and their subordinate bureaus and offices. In a few cases, however, names of organizations or types of organizations are listed in the topical index (Part I), particularly where their location in Part II may not be readily apparent (e.g., local housing authorities, Federal credit unions).

Part III of the index is intended as a convenient list of the names of contractors who are referred to in more than a passing manner within the report. This information is not always apparent from a report title.

The index is arranged by the principal report subjects and cites the reference numbers (B-Numbers) and issue dates of the related reports. The military service or department whose activity is the subject of the cited report is identified by its initial, as follows: Army (A), Navy (N), Air Force (AF), and Defense (D). Classified reports are identified as secret or confidential.

Reports to congressional committees and to Members of Congress are generally under restricted distribution. Such reports are identified by an asterisk (*) preceding the reference number of the report.

A table of the principal subjects appearing in the index is included.

The Defense Accounting and Auditing Division also published an Index of Reports Issued to Congress, its Committees and Members on Defense Activities, Fiscal Years 1959, 1960, and 1961. The arrangement is the same as above except there is no table of principal subjects.

DIGESTS OF GENERAL ACCOUNTING OFFICE REPORTS TO THE CONGRESS DURING FISCAL YEAR 1966

Most of our audit work in the departments and agencies of the Federal Government is performed in furtherance of our policy of directing our available manpower resources to those areas which, in our opinion, will be most productive of significant findings and recommendations for improving Government operations and achieving

greater efficiency and economy.

Accordingly, it must be understood that our reports are not intended as overall evaluations of agency performance with respect to the programs or activities with which the reports are concerned. While we are exerting constant effort to present our findings and recommendations in proper perspective, the conclusions stated in the reports should not be taken as extending to broader areas than indicated in the reports.

In the light of these qualifications, a digest of General Accounting Office reports

to the Congress during fiscal year 1966 is presented below.

CIVIL DEPARTMENTS AND AGENCIES

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

DEPARTMENTWIDE

Review of safety conditions in certain storage areas, primarily in the South Building of the Department of Agriculture, Washington, D.C., B-158427, Apr. 12, 1966

We observed certain fire hazards and unsafe conditions, primarily in printed matter storage areas in the South Building of the Department of Agriculture, Washington, D.C., resulting from (1) unsound housekeeping and warehousing practices, (2) inadequate maintenance of fire extinguishers and electrical equipment, and (3) absence of fire walls and fire doors between printed matter storage areas and an adjacent garage facility. Generally similar conditions were noted in three other governmental agency buildings in Washington, D.C. The Department and the General Services Administration advised us that they had taken corrective action substantially responsive to our proposals.

CREDIT CORPORATION

Contrary to established policy, grain storage rates to be paid on farm stored grain for the 1964-65 storage year under the reseal loan program were established prior to the announcement of the revised Uniform Grain Storage Agreement rates payable to commercial warehousemen, and exceeded the Agreement rates. We estimated that as a result of this action the Corporation would incur additional costs of about \$4.7 million or \$5.6 million. We proposed that, as long as the policy of the Corporation's Board of Directors was to establish storage rates for the reseal program in line with the Agreement rates, the Board establish annual storage rates for the reseal program only after the related Agreement rates had been established.

We proposed also that, before approving such rates, the Board give consideration to whether proposed changes in policies or deviations from policies will unnecessarily increase program costs. On May 12, 1965, the Department an-

necessarily increase program costs. On May 12, 1965, the Department announced new storage rates for grain stored in warehouses operating under the Agreement and stated that the new rates applied also to grain in farm storage under reseal price-support loans. We estimated that the reduced rates would result in savings of approximately \$9.2 million during the 1965-66

storage year.

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INDEX AND FILES SECTION

The Index and Files section is part of the Office of the General Counsel's Legal Information and Reference Service.

Index and Files is responsible for recording and processing all incoming and outgoing correspondence addressed to or signed by the Comptroller General, Deputy Comptroller General, and other officials of the General Accounting Office. The primary responsibility of the section concerns the recording, briefing, and indexing of legal questions submitted to the Comptroller General for decision.

Index and Files has established several card files to identify this correspondence, and GAO audit reports. They include the subject card file, the B-card file, the name card file, and the audit report subject card file.

The subject card file is designed to lead the researcher to the proper B-Number. Subject cards contain the B-Number, the date, and the title of the correspondence. For more complete information on a specific entry the researcher should refer to the B-card file, described below.

There is a special subject term, "Reports--Audit," which is very useful to the researcher who knows the approximate date of the report to be identified. Under this term entries are logged by the report date and include the B-Number and the title of the report.

Names of GAO divisions and offices are also listed in the subject card file. A researcher using a specific division as a subject heading would also need to know the approximate date the report was issued as entries are logged by date. Because entries are not always references to reports, the researcher should also refer to the B-card file.

The B-card file is arranged numerically by B-Number and contains, in date order, the type of correspondence (i.e., letters, reports, office memoranda, etc.), the title of the report or a description of the entry, the division which handled the correspondence, and the report number for the most recent reports.

The name card file lists names of individuals, companies, organizations, etc., and includes all the B-Numbers, the date, and a description of the entry.

The audit report subject file, which began approximately in 1969, is used by Index and Files when a new subject term and B-Number are assigned. A 3x5 index card is made up which contains the new subject term, the new B-Number, and the title of the first report issued under that number. No further entries are made on the card.

There are three specific times that Index and Files makes entries in its card files concerning GAO audit reports. They are the advance review, the final review, and when a report is released by GAO.

In September 1978, Index and Files began to replace the card systems with an automated Correspondence Control System (CCS). Presently, only those documents that routinely flow through the Office of General Counsel are entered, including correspondence addressed to the Comptroller General and GAO audit reports. Eventually, as coverage is expanded, CCS will encompass all significant correspondence, including correspondence signed by division directors. Looking forward to this time and to build consistency between GAO information processing systems, the GAO Thesaurus (GAO report number OIM-79-3) is used as the source of subject matter terms. Future linking of the GAO documents file with the CCS file may provide a unique capability to combine the contents of correspondence with that of all other GAO work products. The card files will be maintained for research prior to September 1978 as there are no plans to input them into the automated correspondence system.

Index and Files is located in Room 7510. GAO staff are welcome to use the files to conduct their own research. Index and Files personnel are available to assist you or conduct research for you if you call the section on 275-5436.

SCORPIO

The Congressional Research Service (CRS) of the Library of Congress permits GAO to use its SCORPIO computer service. SCORPIO is the popular name for the Subject Content-Oriented Retriever for Processing Information On-line. SCORPIO contains nine files, or collections of information. This is a description of two SCORPIO files and how they can be used to identify GAO reports.

The first of these files is the bibliographic information, or CITN file. The CITN file is a collection of references to significant current periodical articles, pamphlets, interest groups, congressional and executive documents, CRS reports, and similar materials selected by CRS. It is a subset of the CRS Bibliographic Data System which was created in 1969.

The CITN file normally includes material from the current year and the previous 2 years, and is updated weekly. (As of April 1980 the 1976 material had not been dropped from the CITN file. CRS is examining the feasibility of enlarging the file to include as much as 5 years on-line.)

GAO provides CRS with copies of all GAO congressional reports. Only classified or similar restricted-access reports are omitted. Where possible, unclassified report digests are given to CRS.

CRS does not include references to all GAO reports in the CITN file. Selection is made on the basis of actual and potential research support value, and pertinence to public policy.

To begin a search for GAO reports on a specific subject, a user must first locate the appropriate subject term or terms to use. There are two ways to do this. The first is to use the hard copy Legislative Indexing Vocabulary (LIV) to identify the term or terms, and then select these terms on-line. (A copy of LIV terms is located in GAO's Audit Reference Services Section.) The second way is to browse the term or terms on-line and then select the appropriate ones from the browse display. The second of these SCORPIO files is the Library of Congress Computerized Catalog, or LCCC file. The LCCC file contains references extracted from the Library's MARC data base. In general, the references consist of English-language books imprinted from 1968 or cataloged from 1969. French-language books cataloged from 1973, German, Portuguese, and Spanish-language books imprinted from 1975, and references to the Science and Main Reading Room collections. The subject areas covered by the above references are essentially those found in the Library of Congress card catalog. The file is updated approximately every 6 weeks.

Only selected GAO reports have been cataloged by the Library of Congress. The number of years (1969-present) covered by LCCC is its greatest advantage over the CITN file.

Searching in the LCCC file is similar to that of the CITN file, except Library of Congress subject headings are used instead of LIV terms. A hard copy of the Library of Congress Subject Headings is located in the GAO Audit Reference Services Section.

In conducting a search in LCCC, the user must be aware that subject headings are updated and new terms are added to reflect current needs. This is an important factor in searching for reports which cover long periods of time. The user must locate and select all the relevant subject headings.

In performing an actual file seach, first select the relevant subject headings, then select the term "General Accounting Office" (drop the "U.S." and the period after the word "Office" in this file). Combine these sets together using the appropriate Boolean Operators. This produces a final set of documents published by GAO on a specific subject. See an example of a LCCC citation displayed in the item format below:

These catalogs, furnished to the GAO Library by CRS, are issued in a computer printout format and are taken from the CRS bibliographic data base. They are divided into two categories, which are subject and author catalogs.

The subject catalogs use LIV terms, and author catalogs list GAO reports alphabetically by report title.

The Monthly Catalog of United States Government Publications was first issued in 1895 and has had six name changes. Since January 1951 it has been issued under its current title, and is simply known as the Monthly Catalog.

Currently, an alphabetical list of Government authors in the preliminary pages locates the catalog sequence of documents issued by a specific agency. This list is compiled each month and includes only Government authors of documents received and cataloged during that timespan. This format makes it possible to look at all GAO publications which are grouped together in one specific section of each monthly catalog.

The index format to the Monthly Catalog has varied over the years. Currently, the index consists of four parts: Author (personal authors, editors, coauthors, corporate authors, and conferences); title (titles, series titles, and sub- or alternate titles); subject, and series/report number (report numbers and series statements). A dictionary-style index has also been used. This type of index groups authors, titles, and subjects together in one alphabetical listing.

GAO reports can be identified in the current index by searching under General Accounting Office in the corporate source index, under the title of the report in the title index, and under its subject matter or, since July 1976, the appropriate LC subject heading for the report in the subject index.

An index is currently published with each monthly catalog and covers only those publications included in that issue. A semiannual index began publication in 1976 and covers Jan.-June and July-Dec. issues. An annual index is also published.

The Monthly Catalog is also a file available through the Dialog Information Retrieval Service, a computerized data base system. Coverage begins in July 1976 and continues through the present date. The file is updated monthly. A computer printout of GAO reports on a specific topic can be obtained by using basic index terms (abstracts, descriptor, note, and title words) or descriptor terms (generally derived from LC subject headings), and combining these with the corporate source--General Accounting Office. The National Technical Information Service (NTIS) of the U.S. Department of Commerce is the central source for the public sale of Government-sponsored research, development, and engineering reports and other analyses prepared by Federal agencies, their contractors or grantees, or by special technical groups.

The Government Reports Announcements & Index is issued biweekly. Reports are arranged by subject field and group structure. This arrangement permits browsing in a broad subject area, but is not the best method of identifying a specific report. See next page for listing of subject fields:

The indexes are not cumulated until the end of the year when NTIS publishes the Government Reports Annual Index.

The Government Reports Annual Index contains the five separate indexes previously described. The bibliographic citations and abstracts for documents referred to in this Index are published in the biweekly Government Reports Announcements and Index issued during the year. The GAO Audit Reference Services Section does not retain these biweekly issues once the annual index is received, but it uses information contained in this index to retrieve the bibliographic citations and abstracts through its access to the Dialog Information Retrieval Service, a computerized data base system.

The Dialog NTIS data base file includes reports from 1964 to the present and is updated biweekly. A computer printout of GAO reports on a specific subject can be obtained by using basic or free index terms and combining these with General Accounting Office as the corporate source. example below:

AMERICAN STATISTICS INDEX

American Statistics Index. Washington: Congressional Information Source, 1974- Ref. Z1223.A1U47.

The American Statistics Index (ASI) aims to be a master guide and index to all the statistical publications of the U.S. Government. It was created to meet the need, expressed in 1971 by the President's Commission on Federal Statistics, for "a central catalog of data available in government agencies . . . a single source in which one could locate all data currently collected by the Federal Government on a particular subject."

Specifically, the purpose of ASI is to perform the following functions, promptly and comprehensively:

- -Identify the statistical data published by all branches and agencies of the Federal Government.
- -Catalog the publications in which these data appear, providing full bibliographic information about each publication.
- -Announce new publications as they appear.
- -Describe the contents of the publications fully.
- -Index this information in full subject detail.
- -Micropublish virtually all the publications covered by ASI, thereby providing, on a continuing basis, reliable access to the statistics themselves. (Maintained in the GAO Audit Reference Services Section.)

ASI is published in two volumes, Abstract and Index, annually.

The base edition of ASI is the 1974 Annual and Retrospective Edition, referred to hereafter as the Retrospective Edition. This edition provides comprehensive abstracting and indexing coverage of Federal Government statistical publications.

In the case of repetitive or continuing publications (annuals or periodicals), which represent continuing series of statistics over long periods of time, the Retrospective Edition does not describe each issuance published since 1960. Rather, it describes in full the format and contents of the most recent edition as of Jan. 1, 1974, and, where possible, characterizes major changes in format that have occurred in recent years.

The <u>Retrospective Edition</u> fully supersedes and expands the coverage of an initial ASI 1973 edition, which was limited to social statistics.

The <u>Retrospective Edition</u> is currently supplemented by the following ASI annual editions, which cover publications issued between 1974 and 1978.

The ASI First Annual Supplement (covering publications issued Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 1974) was published in May 1975. It cumulates coverage of 1974 publications originally provided by ASI 1974 Monthly Supplements.

The ASI Second Annual Supplement (covering publications issued Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 1975) was published in May 1976. It cumulates coverage of all 1975 publications originally provided by ASI 1975 Monthly Supplements.

The ASI Third Annual Supplement (covering publications issued Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 1976) was published in May 1977. It cumulates coverage of all 1976 publications originally provided by ASI 1976 Monthly Supplements.

The ASI Fourth Annual Supplement (covering publications issued Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 1977) was published in May 1978. It cumulates coverage of all 1977 publications originally provided by ASI Monthly Supplements.

The ASI 1978 Fifth Annual Supplement (covering publications issued Jan. 1-Dec. 31, 1978) was published in 1979. It cumulates coverage of all 1978 publications originally provided by ASI 1978 Monthly Supplements.

The ASI Monthly Supplements provide current abstracts and indexing for all new publications issued during each month of the current year. These include wholly new publications, new items in series, and updates or new editions of annuals, semiannuals, or other publications covered in previous ASI editions.

Monthly Supplements may also include abstracts for some publications that were issued prior to the current year, but only recently came to the attention of ASI staff members. Such publications are covered, provided they are still current enough to be of general interest.

Publications included in ASI cover a wide range of subjects, reflecting the many concerns of central and regional Federal agencies. These issuing agencies are listed in the detailed table of contents in the abstracts volume, and in the list of "Issuing Agencies and ASI Accession Number" in the index volume. ASI abstracts and indexes all Federal agency publications that contain social, economic, demographic, or natural resources data, and a selection of publications with scientific and technical data.

ASI includes all Federal publications that contain primary data of research value or secondary data collected on a specific subject, and also special studies and analyses or other statistics-related materials. All types of publications are covered, whether published as periodicals, as special one-time reports, as items within a larger continuing report series, or as annual or biennial reports.

Congressional (includes General Accounting Office) publications that contain substantial statistical information are contained in ASI.

Ordinarily, research in ASI will begin with the index volume. The ASI indexes are designed to lead you to the information from a variety of starting points. The four basic ASI indexes, and how they can be used to identify GAO reports, are described in the following examples:

SUBJECT AND NAME INDEX

This index contains references to subjects, to corporate authors, and to individual authors of articles and publications where the author's name appears on the title page.

In the subject and name index, a user could first search for the subject term that applies to the GAO report. See example below:

CATEGORY INDEX

The category index contains references to all publications, tables, and groups of tables that contain breakdowns of statistical data by State, industry, age, or some other standard category.

There are 21 such categories which reflect the major standard breakdowns found in the publications covered by ASI. For purposes of this index, we have divided the categories into three broad areas, as follows:

TITLE INDEX

Titles are listed alphabetically in natural word order, as they appear in the abstracts volume. Titles beginning with numbers (e.g., "1970 Census . . .") appear at the end of the index. Where appropriate, alternate word orders of titles have also been provided.

In addition to publication title, titles of individual. reports within a publication series are indexed, as are the titles of all periodical articles receiving individual abstracts.

ASI is also a file available through ORBIT, a computerized data base system. (It also will shortly be available on-line through the Dialog Information Retrieval Service.) Coverage begins in 1973 and continues to the present (selected coverage of publications issued during the 1960's is also included). The file is updated monthly.

A computer printout of GAO reports on a specific subject can be obtained by selecting the subject term and combining it with General Accounting Office. See example on next page:
