## DIGEST:

1. There is no basis to preclude or disturb contract award merely because awardee submits lower price than protester.

Ouestion of whether awardee has in-house 2. equipment necessary to perform testing requirements of IFB is matter of responsibility, an affirmative determination of which GAO will not consider except in circumstances not present here.

Department of the Navy to Stanwick Co. (Stanwick) Department of the Navy to Stanwick Co. (Stanwick) National Pump & Injector Sales & Service, Inc. under invitation for bids (IFB) No. N00244-80-B-2261. AGC 20000

National alleges that the price offered by Stanwick is unrealistically low and Stanwick does not have the in-house equipment necessary to perform the testing requirements of the contract.

We have repeatedly held that a bidder's submission of a bid which a competitor considers too low does not constitute a legal basis for precluding or disturbing a contract award. Richy's Prototype Sheetmetal, B-198092, March 31, 1980, 80-1 CPD 241 and cases cited therein. Rather, whether a bidder can perform at its low price involves the bidder's responsibility as a prospective contractor. This Office does not consider a contracting officer's affirmative determination of responsibility unless there is a showing of fraud or bad faith or the solicitation contains definitive responsibility criteria which allegedly have not been applied. Tempesta & Son Co., B-199469, July 21, 1980 and cases cited therein. Neither exception is present

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Similarly, the allegation that Stanwick does not have the necessary in-house equipment to perform the IFB's testing requirements also involves the contracting officer's determination of Stanwick's responsibility.

Accordingly, the protest is dismissed.
