Automated Datatron, Inc. (ADI) filed a protest with this Office on July 21, 1980, alleging that the Social Security Administration (SSA) improperly rejected ADI's bid submitted in response to invitation for bids No. SSA-80-0145. The IFB contained a brand name or equal purchase description requiring bidders to offer cer-cn 60067 tain models of microfilm manufactured by Eastman Kodak Company (Kodak) or "equal" microfilms; that is any other manufacturer's microfilms which would meet the salient characteristics listed in the IFB. ADI offered microfilms manufactured by Rochester Film Corporation DL60557 (RFC), but did not specify the precise film type. Examination of descriptive literature ADI submitted after bid opening, revealed that RFC manufactured several types of microfilms that met ADI's description in the bid, and not all of those types were equal to the Kodak microfilm listed in the IFB. Therefore, SSA rejected ADI's bid as nonresponsive.

On October 9, 1980, ADI filed a suit, Civil Action ✓No. 80-2582, seeking a declarative judgment and permanent injunctive relief in the United States District Court 00748 for the District of Columbia, placing the material issues involved in the protest before the court. order dated October 23, the court entered a judgment against ADI and in favor of the Government.

The courts decision on the merits constitutes a final adjudication barring further action by this Office. See 4 C.F.R. § 20.10 (1980); Inflated Products Company, Inc. -- Reconsideration, /B-189115, July 19, 1978, 78-2 CPD 47.

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The protest is dismissed.
