## Decision

**Matter of:** GE American Communications, Inc.--Reconsideration

**File:** B-240385.2

**Date:** January 22, 1991

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### DECISION

GE American Communications, Inc. requests reconsideration of our decision in GE American Communications, Inc., B-240385, Nov. 16, 1990, 90-2 CPD ¶ 398, in which we denied its protest against the award of a contract to U.S. Electroynamics, Inc. (USEI) by the Defense Communications Agency under request for proposals No. DCA200-90-R-0024.

We deny the request for reconsideration because the request provides no basis for reconsidering our prior decision.

The protester in essence repeats arguments it made previously and expresses disagreement with our decision.<sup>1/</sup> Under our Bid Protest Regulations, to obtain reconsideration the requesting party must show that our prior decision may contain either errors of fact or law or present information not previously considered that warrants reversal or modification of our decision. 4 C.F.R. § 21.12(a). The repetition of arguments made during our consideration of the original protest and mere


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<sup>1/</sup> We also note that the protester contends in its reconsideration request that USEI failed to receive necessary licenses, which the protester now asserts constitute definitive responsibility criteria, within 50 days of receipt of initial proposals as the protester believes was required by the solicitation. We held, in our original decision, that this constituted a performance obligation, but, in any event, USEI did receive the necessary licenses within 50 days of the agency's receipt of USEI's best and final offer, which satisfies the actual solicitation requirement.

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disagreement with our decision do not meet this standard.
