Matter of: Materials, Communication & Computers, Inc.

DECISION

Materials, Communication & Computers, Inc. protests the award of Contract No. N66032-94-D-0010 to CTA, Inc., for the acquisition of automated data processing support services, for the Department of the Navy, Naval Computer and Telecommunications Station, New Orleans.

We dismiss the protest because there are protests of the same procurement currently pending before the General Services Administration Board of Contract Appeals (GSBCA). Specifically, IMS, Inc. has protested the award to CTA under GSBCA No. 12830-P, and SAIC, Inc. has protested the award under GSBCA No. 12834-P.

Our Bid Protest Regulations provide that after a particular procurement is protested to the GSBCA, that procurement may not, while the protest is before the GSBCA, be the subject of a protest to the General Accounting Office. 4 C.F.R. § 21.3(m)(6). As the procurement in question is the subject of a protest currently before the GSBCA raising matters dispositive of the issue of entitlement for award, we will not consider this protest. Mannesmann Tally Corp., B-238790, Mar. 22, 1990, 90-1 CPD ¶ 320.

Accordingly, the protest is dismissed.
