This responds to your inquiry concerning Mr.
, a native of Palau, regarding his student loans and work status.

We have reviewed your inquiry; however, the questions you raise are the responsibility of other agencies of the government.

In an effort to provide you with some assistance, we contacted the Department of Interior, Office of Territorial and International Affairs, and the Department of Education, Office of Policy Development-Post Secondary Education.

We were informed by the Department of Interior that while there is a proposed Compact of Free Association between the United States and Palau, it has not been ratified. The Compact is still subject to negotiation and ratification. As such, the information you received in the April 8, 1985 letter from the Department of Interior remains accurate. In summary, while Trust Territory citizens are eligible for student loans, if they are planning to attend schools in the United States, they are not eligible to obtain a work status.
