The Assistant Administrator, Employment Standards Administration, United States Department of Labor, by letter dated September 17, 1985, recommended to our Office that the names Kaliski Painting Company and Boris Kaliski, individually and as Owner, be placed on the debarred bidders list for violations of the Davis-Bacon Act, 40 U.S.C. §§ 276a to 276a-5 (1982), with respect to the above-referenced contract.


We concur with the Assistant Administrator's recommendation. The Davis-Bacon Act provides that the Comptroller General is to debar persons or firms whom he finds have disregarded their obligations to their employees under the Act. 40 U.S.C. § 276a-2. Our review of the record in this case confirms that there were substantial violations which constitute a disregard of obligations to your employees with respect to the minimum wage provisions of the Act.

Accordingly, your name and that of Kaliski Painting Company, will be included on a list of ineligible bidders to be distributed to all departments of the Federal government. Pursuant to statutory direction at 40 U.S.C. § 276a-2, no contract shall be awarded to Kaliski Painting Company, or to

you, or to any firm, corporation, partnership or association in which you have an interest until 3 years have elapsed from the date of publication of that list.
