There is returned herewith, without countersignature, Department of Agriculture Transfer Appropriation Warrant No. 8, proposing to transfer 3345,000 from the appropriation "12-2110 Salaries and Expenses, Agricultural Adjustment Administration" under appropriation accounts as follows:

Salaries and Expenses, Agricultural Adjustment
Administration, (Marketing Agreements, Mog Cholora
Viruses and Serum), 1936 and 1937 \$ 30,000.00

Salaries and Expenses, Agricultural Adjustment Administration, (Soil Survey, Sawaii), 1930 and 1937

15,000.00

Salaries and Empenses, Agricultural Adjustment Administration, (Tobacco Compacts and Agreements Among States), 1936-1938

300,000.00

There is cited on the warrant as authority for the proposed action the provisions of Public Re. 739, 74th Congress, approved June 22, 1936 which are as follows:

#### Bureau of Animal Industry

"Marketing agreements with respect to hog cholera virus and serum: The sum of \$30,000 of the appropriation made by section 12 (a) of the agricultural Adjustment Act, approved May 12, 1933, is hereby made available during the fiscal years 1936 and 1937, to carry into effect sections 56 to 60, inclusive, of the lot approved August 24, 1935 (49 Stat. 781, 782), entitled 'An Act to amend the Agricultural Adjustment act, and for other purposes', including the employment of persons and means in the District of Columbia and elsewhere."

#### Sureau of Cammistry and Soils

"Toil survey of the Hawaiian Islands: Not to exceed 315,000 of the funds appropriated by section 12 (a) of the Agricultural Adjustment Act, as amended, is hereby made available, to remain available until June 30, 1937, to meet all accessary expenses of the Sureau of Chamistry and Soils, Department of Agriculture, for the completion of a soil survey of the Hawaiian Islands, including personal services for map-irating work in the District of Columbia and alsowhere."

### Agricultural Adjustment Administration

Tobacco compacts and agreements among States: Not to exceed \$300,000 of the funds appropriated by section 12 (a) of the Agricultural Adjustment Act, as amended, is hereby made available, to remain available until June 30, 1936, to carry into effect the provisions of the Act approved April 25, 1936 (Public Act atmosred 534, Jeventy-fourth Congress), entitled 'An Act relating to compacts and agreements emong States in which tobacco is produced in providing for the control of production of, or commerce in, tobacco in such States, and for other purposes'; including the employment of persons and means in the District of Columbia and elsewhere, printing, advances to tobacco commissions, loans to associations of tobacco producers, and other expenses authorized by the provisions of the said Act.

In a letter of this office dated July 14, 1936, to the Chief, division of Bookkeeping and marrants of your Department, it was suggested that the appropriation accounts to which these amounts were proposed to be credited were not in accordance with the intent of the statutes. In letter dated July 16, 1936, the Chief, Sivision of Bookkeeping and Parrants, stated in part as follows:

"The provisions of the Act involved in these items are shown in the Act under 'Eurem of Animal Industry - Marketing Agreements with respect to bog cholers virus and serum,' 'Sureau of Chemistry and Soils - will Survey of the Hawaiiam Islands,' and 'Agricultural Adjustment Administration - Polacoo compacts and agreements among States.' In each of these paragraphs it provides that funds appropriated by Section 12(a) of the Agricultural Adjustment act, as amended (established under tit'

'41017 Galaries and Expenses, Agricultural Adjustment Administration'), are made available, with certain ileval year limitations, to meet expenses or carry into effect, cartain lines of work not included under the master appropriation sited above. There are no reappropriations or transfers of funds specifically provided for, and were it not for the change in fiscal year limitations, it is assumed that these activities could be serried on under the original appropriation. However, in order to provide for a more definite accounting for the three items in question under the extension of availability of funds under the original appropriation, it was deemed desirable to identify and establish such extensions under the title of appropriation involved, adding thereto the new fiscal year limitations, and within parentheses, the designations of the new activities. This is in line with the procedure hitherto followed and there would appear to be no material reason may the titles shown on Agriculture Transfer Apprepriation Warrant No. 8, may not stand as drawn."

This statement, particularly that there are no reappropriations or transfers of funds specifically provided for and that were it not for the change in fiscal year limitations the activities could be carried on under the original appropriation, does not appear to be in accordance with the facts. The apparent purpose of the enactment was to reappropriate and make available for purposes for which they were not theretofore available moneys which had been apprepriated for administoring the agricultural adjustment Ast. The moneys so reappropriated for the three specific purposes mentioned are no longer available for expenses of administering the Agricultural Adjustment Act. Consequently, there is involved here notes ordinary transfer of funds for excenditure in carrying out the purposes for which the basic appropriation was made but new appropriations with a designation of the source of the Amde. Therefore, it is suggested that the items here under consideration be set up for credit under appropriation titles substantially as follows:

Marketing Agreements, Mog Cholera Virus and Serum (Fransfer from Salaries and Expenses, Agricultural Adjustment Administration), 1936-1937.

Soil Survey, Hammii (Transfer from Salaries and Expenses Agricultural Adjustment Administration), 1956-1937

Totacco Compacts and Agreements among States (Transfer from Salaries and Exponess, Agricultural Adjustment Administration), 1930-1938.
