I have your latter of February 20, 1953, with enclosures, requesting a decision as to the validity of a bid submitted by Longborn Paint Company, San Antonio, Texas.

by invitation No. 41-612-53-61 bids were requested—to be opened at 1 p.m. on February 19, 1953—for furnishing six items of paint in accordance with certain specifications. It is stated that Longham Paint Company was not included on your Bidders List and, therefore, a copy of the invitation was not mailed to that company. However, it appears that the company saw a copy of the invitation and forwarded a letter dated February 12, 1953, as follows:

"Shipment will be made within 18 days after receipt of order. A cash discount of 1% will be allowed for payment within 10 days. Contracting employing, normally, 19 wags carriers, proposes to manufacture items as San Automio, Texas."

The company has effected to furnish paint exactly as required by the specifications and, by referring to the invitation, has impliedly agreed to shide by all the provisions contained therein. The invitation number and date of opening is shown and the bid apparently was opened together with the other bids at the appointed time.

In the present case, the Chilure to substitute the bid on Standard Form 33 clearly in not such a deviation on small affect either the price, quality or quantity of the supplies effected and is not projudicial to the rights of the other bidders. The informality here involved is not one of substance and properly may be unived by the Consuments, See 30 Chips Gen. 1795

Accordingly, you are savised that the informality may be writed and the bid of the company considered along with the other bids.
