#### REPORT ON AUDIT

### OUTDOOR RECREATION RESOURCES REVIEW COMMISSION

#### FOR THE PERIOD

#### JUNE 28, 1958, THROUGH SEPTEMBER 1, 1962

The General Accounting Office has made an audit of the Outdoor Recreation Resources Review Commission for the period of its existence, June 28, 1958, through September 1, 1962, pursuant to the Budget and Accounting Act, 1921 (31 U.S.C. 53), and the Accounting and Auditing Act of 1950 (31 U.S.C. 67). Our audit included tests of the financial transactions to the extent deemed appropriate and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. The examination was performed in Washington, D.C.

#### GENERAL COMMENTS

The Outdoor Recreation Resources Review Commission was created by the act of June 28, 1958 (72 Stat. 238), as a temporary bipartisan agency in the executive branch of the Government to preserve, develop, and make accessible adequate outdoor recreational facilities to all American people of present and future generations; to assure the spiritual, cultural, and physical benefits that outdoor recreation provides by determining present and future needs; to obtain information on available resources; and to make recommendations for meeting these goals to the President, the Congress, and the States and Territories.

The Commission was composed of 15 members: 2 majority and 2 minority members of the Senate Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs appointed by the President of the Senate, 2 majority and 2 minority members of the House Committee on Interior and Insular Affairs appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and 7 citizens appointed by the President of the United States. The President appointed Laurance S. Rockefeller as Chairman of the Commission. The membership is shown in the appendix to this report.

The Commission, as required by the enabling legislation, established an advisory council composed of liaison officers from 15 Federal departments and agencies and 25 citizen members representative of various major geographical areas, citizen interest groups, and State agencies having a responsibility for outdoor recreation. During its existence the Commission employed about 60 professional, administrative, and clerical people and about 35 consultants on a part-time basis. The activities were directed by the Executive Director, Francis W. Sargent.

On January 31, 1962, the Commission submitted its report, "Outdoor Recreation For America," to the President and to the Congress. Also, the Commission prepared, in separate volumes, 27 study reports covering its studies and surveys of the Nation's outdoor recreation resources and needs.

As required by the act, as amended, the Commission terminated its operations on September 1, 1962.

#### FINANCING

Activities of the Commission were financed by funds appropriated by the Congress as shown in the schedule. The act establishing the Commission authorized no more than \$2,500,000 for the purposes of the Commission and provided that moneys appropriated would be available until expended. The Congress appropriated \$2,500,000 of which \$2,370,816 had been expended at September 1, 1962.

The fiscal operations of the Commission were performed by the General Services Administration (GSA) for which a charge of \$69,500 was made.

Property acquired by the Commission at a cost of \$22,992 was transferred to GSA on or before September 1, 1962.

#### OPINION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENT

In our opinion, the accompanying statement of financial activity presents fairly the receipts and expenditures of the Outdoor Recreation Resources Review Commission for the period June 28, 1958, through September 1, 1962, in conformity with the principles and standards of accounting prescribed by the Comptroller General of the United States.
