Dear Mr. Secretary:

We refer to report LCPM dated November 7, 1972, relative to the protest of Amour, Inc., against the sward of a contract to another firm under invitation for bids F41612-72-8-0402, issued by Shappard Air Force Base, Texas.

Enclosed herewith is a copy of our decision of today danying the protest. However, during the course of our review, we noticed that a bid was rejected as nonresponsive because one of the individual sureties listed on the bid bond failed to show a net worth equal to the total penal amount of the bond. In this regard, we are enclosing for your information a copy of our decision 52 Comp. Gan. 1844 (8-176392, October 10, 1972), wherein we concluded that the matter of the net worth of an individual surety on a bid bond reflects upon the responsibility of the surety and does not relate to the responsiveness of the bid, and such net worth may properly be determined after bid opening, subject to the time restraints of the producement.
