Dear Colonel Meitz:

· Your letter of Harch 37, 1973, requests advice as to whither Mr. Edgar L. Kingsborough may at this time have 199 hours of annual leave which was forfeited at the end of the 1972 leave year substituted for an equivalent number of hours of sick leave charged to him during that leave year. Mr. Kingsborough has been on sick leave since May of 1972 and we understand that he was to be separated for disability retirement in May of 1973. Your letter states that the forfaiture of 199 hours annual leave is the result of an administrative error, in which regard Mr. Kingsborough explains that he was not properly advised of the status of his annual leave account and that the substitution which he would otherwise have requested was not automatically made by your agency.

In general, amoual leave which has been subject to forfeiture at the end of a prior leave year may not be retronatively substitund for sick loave for the sole purpose of avoiding that forfeiture. See Federal Personnel Manuel, Chapter 630, subchapter 83-4. In 31 Comp. Gan. 524 (1952) we recognized, however, that absorce due to illness may be charged to accrued annual leave if timely requested by the amployee and approved by the administrative office concerned.

Where, as in Hr. Kingsborough's case, an amployes's illness commonced a considerable period of time prior to the end of a leave year, thus procluding his use of accrued annual leave for purposes other than illness, we have presumed that if he had been advised of the state of his leave account he would have requested forfaitable annual leave to be applied to cover an equivalent period of absence prior to the close of that leave yes! Where lack of knowledge of his loave balance is not attributable to may fault on the part of the employee, we have interposed no objection to the substitution of annual leave for an equivalent amount of sick larve, notwithstanding that such annual leave may have been regarded
