Dear Mr. Rangel:

In accordance with your request of April 16, 1973, and subsequent meetings with your office, we have compared the sentences of convicted organized crime figures for the 4-year period July 1, 1968, through June 30, 1972, with fiscal year 1970 and 1972 statistics compiled by the Administrative Office of the U.S. Courts for all convicted criminals. The Administrative Office did not compile statistics by offense categories for fiscal years 1969 and 1971.

During the 4 years, 1,365 criminal defendants, identified by the Department of Justice as being associated with organized crime, were convicted. Their violations comprise 17 offense categories. More than half (61 percent) were convicted for extortion, racketeering, and threats (420); 1 gambling and lottery (209); 2 and embezzlement and fraud (205).

Enclosure I is a comparison of convicted criminal defendants' sentences by offense category. Enclosure II is

a comparison by district court of the sentences received for gambling and lottery, and narcotics convictions.

The comparisons show that, in most of the offense categories, organized crime figures were more likely than other convicted criminals to receive a prison sentence and that the average length of their prison sentences was in most cases greater than the sentences received by all convicted criminals in fiscal years 1970 and 1972.

In almost all the offense categories the number of convicted organized crime figures is very small compared with all persons sentenced in fiscal years 1970 and 1972. Therefore, we urge caution in drawing conclusions from apparent differences in the types of sentences received and the average months of prison sentences.

We discussed the data in this report with the Department of Justice and the Administrative Office. We plan no 37 further distribution of this report unless you agree or publicly announce its contents.
