Procurement by Government of Egypt, using funds borrowed from the Agency for International Development, is not Federal procurement nor procurement involving Federal grant funds. Therefore, protest involving that procurement is not subject to review by GAO.

Bucyrus-Erie Company protests the award of a contract to the Koehring Company under solicitation No. 4-AID-78 and Addendum, issued by the Egyptian Dredging Company. The protester advises that the procurement is being conducted by the Government of Egypt using funds borrowed from and repayable with interest to the Agency for International Development AGC 00097 (AID Loan No. 263-k-040).

This Office does not consider foreign country procurements financed by AID loans since it is clear that such procurements are neither a procurement by or for an agency of the Federal Government nor a procurement by a Federal grantee. See Pettibone Corporation--Reconsideration, 58 Comp. Gen. 737 (1979), 79-2 CPD 133 and cases cited therein.

This protest is dismissed.
