Subject: Department of Agriculture, Rural Housing Service: The American Rescue Plan Act Emergency Rural Health Care Grant Program

Pursuant to section 801(a)(2)(A) of title 5, United States Code, this is our report on a major rule promulgated by the Department of Agriculture, Rural Housing Service (USDA) entitled "The American Rescue Plan Act Emergency Rural Health Care Grant Program" (RHS-21-CF-0009). We received the rule on August 13, 2021. It was published in the *Federal Register* as a notice of funds availability on August 12, 2021. 86 Fed. Reg. 44332. The effective date is October 12, 2021.

According to USDA, the notice announces the availability of up to \$500 million in grant funding, appropriated under the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, Pub. L. No. 117-2, 135 Stat. 4 (Mar. 11, 2021), for the establishment of the Emergency Rural Health Care (ERHC) Grant Program. USDA stated funds will be made available and distributed between two tracks of funding to eligible applicants: Track One, Recovery grants to offer support for rural health care services in the form of immediate relief to address the economic conditions arising from the COVID-19 emergency; and Track Two, Impact grants to offer longer-term funding to advance ideas and solutions to support long-term sustainability of rural health.
