It has been held by the Couptroiller Genaral (1 53791, 13 C. G. 294, 237) that in euch easet there shorid be a written order cr agroungt in wivanoes, siguad by the responaibio administrative officer of amoh of the departamers or ofrioss copporned, and atid agroment aheuld be attanhed to the request Lor transfor of appropriations or vonchar for rofinareaniat for filing in the office of the Comptrallar cemerral.
 other axpences of the Goversment incidant to the talding ever of the conl mines for Governent oparation an Hay 1, 393, an allotront of $\$ 10,000,000$ ves mede to the Secretary of the Interior from the Emergency Fuan for the Proaidont (Soe Exhibit 7 attachod). Criginaily. the work inoident to the taking over of tho winea wean onerind out by the staffs of tha Saltd Fuals edministretion for Iar and the Bitamineas Coal Bivision. The latter has sinoe beon Liquilated. Allotwante werm made by the Seoretary Irom the $\$ 20,000,000$ frud to anch of theop pnite of the Department to muppleasat, whare necessitated by the now meric, funds already availabie to them.
"Later it was detemined to be adminsitrativaly soumit to oreate a soperate agmery within the Department to oamy on the fedmeral oporration of the ninos and thave was accordingly areated on $3 u l y, 1,1943$, the Ceal Minoe Administration. It was intended, however, thit the Conl Mines Administration also ahould mabe use of eactain aarvices of the Salld Foble Adrainistration for Wer and the Bituratnors Conl Difibion
as a masture of cooncy troa a gevorrmantal mininistration atondpoint and that Imtention han beop oarrind oatt from the start. boanmo of an
 referreal to in the deoletion of the cumptrailion Gommel above notod. Such an oudery it is abourod, has bean mogaired by the Couptroliter onneral to estahisish on intention, in adranow, to pexierem pertioniap work on a basis of roluburuemant betwor appropriations.

"'he intention of the Departanent as above statad is, hownver, claarly reflooted in a sertes of introdepartanemal cormuntastions and, as eridenoing the understanding under which the activitiea ware oarried on, i am attaching the following exhibites
"1. Dullatin Ho. 3 of the Coal 隹ines Adrainistration in Paragraph 3 of which it appears that the Depaty Coal isinea Administrator was appointed on Joly 1,1943 . On that date the Coal lifnes Administration began to function.
"2. A menorandum dated suly 16 fran the Undex Sacretary to the Searetary in mubered paragraph 4 of which olearly appeare the contralised character of cortain parts of the organization and from which there clearly appesirs the intention of joint ifnencing.
"3. 'enarandun dated August 3 from as inireater of the Eituninous Cosl Division, to the ianagers of all the Division Fiolu arices conoerning raportinu by them for purpose of mutual reimbursement by the Salid Fuala Administration for fiar and the Coal sinss Admintstration. Fron the last sentence of the firet paragraph and from the fourth sentence of numbered paragraph 1 of this momerandun there clearly appeare the intention to operate on a reimbursable basis.
"4. Benarandura datod July 23 from the ijepaty Coal ines Adratnistrator to the Secretary clearily indicating the intention to operite on a rem imbursement basis. it will be noted that the item mentioned are not all inclusive as the work at the time was in the formative stage.
"5. femorandur dated July 28 to employees of the Mtuminous Cosl Ifivision fron the Secretary of the interior in the fourth paragraph of Which therw clearly appears ovidence of the intention of joint finanaing by the Golid Fuele Administration Ior har the Coal ixines Administrem tion of certain activities.
"6. Hemorandun dated Decombar 24, 1943 from the Searetary of the Interior to the Depaty Solid Iuals Administrater and Deputy Coal idines Adainistrator (both of which offices are now held by Dr. C. J. Yotter) contirming verbal instructions unter which all of the l'oregoile was oarried on. The foregoing information is furnishad in support of the attached voucher for reinbureement of the Solid suals adninistration by the coal innes Administration in the amount of 22,30743 covering
sarvices rendered the latter by the fomer during the period from July 1,1943 through ootobar 28, 1943. It is recoamended that this information be accopted as ovidence of advance intention of reimioursement aufficiont ro meat the requirements of the Economy Act as set forth in faragraph 1 of this letter for this and subsequent vouchers."

It is understood from the foregoing that the Aoting Deputy Administrator requests upon your behalf, and parsuant to 31 U.S.C. 74, the decision of this office upon the question presented with respect to the payment of the voucher which, having been approved and certified, was forwanded with his letter.

Section 601 of the act of June 30, 2932; as amonded, 31 U.S.C. 686, contemplates an advance agreement as to the services to be rendored and the reimburaenent contemplated, and, ordinarily, that sinould be regarded as essential. 13 Comp. Gan. 234. Paxticularly where quactions nay arlse as to the anount transferable or as to the relative Liabilitiae for axy expensas co incurred without authority of $l_{\text {alw }}$, the advance agroemant may be a significant, and perhaps controlling, gride. 22 conp. ien. 74323 id. 181.

However, in otherwise proper eabes involving reimharsememt for mork done rather than an advance payment for work to be dome, the lack of a speoific agreoment doos not necossarily preclude reinaturseaent upon the basis of actual costs incurred. A- $55201 ;$ April 15, 19373 10-31862, yebruary 27, 1943. In the presont case; the exhibits forwarded with the above letter adequately establish that a reinurursable arrangement for service: to be rendered was in contenplation, and no question upon that point will bo required to be raised in the audit of the applicable vouchers.
