Dear Mr. Chairman:

As requested in your letter of August 9. 1977, we reviewed the use of helicopters in the Thirteenth Coast Guard District to provide emergency medical services in inland areas. On January 19, 1978, we briefed your office on our observations on each of the points raised in your letter. In general, we found that in the Thirteenth District:

- -- The Coast Guard responds to all bonafide requests for emergency medical services in inland areas when the weather does not prohibit the use of helicopters.
- --The Coast Guard has adequate capability to provide inland emergency medical services.
- --The inland emergency medical missions performed did not interfere with the performance of the Coast Guard's primary missions.
- --Several other agencies, including the Department of Defense, the National Guard, and the Forest Service, also provide helicopter emergency medical services in Oregon and Washington.

After the briefing, your office requested that in lieu of a report, we should transmit copies of the exhibits used during the briefing.

As arranged with your office, this latter and the enclosure will be available for general distribution to interested parties.



- I. COAST GUARD RESPONDED TO ALL BONAFIDE REQUESTS FOR EMS IN THE 13TH DISTRICT
 - -- THE 3 AIR STATIONS FLEW 223 INLAND TMS MISSIONS DURING FISCAL YEARS 1976 THROUGH 1977
 - -- THE NUMBER OF REQUESTS DENIED COULD NOT BE DETERMINED
 - --WE JOUND NO INDICATION THAT REQUESTS WERE DENIED FOR ANY REASON OTHER THAN WEATHER
- II. COAST GUARD HAS ADEQUATE CAPABILITY TO PROVIDE INLAND HELICOPTER EMS
 - --MEDICALLY TRAINED PERSONNEL WERE GENERALLY AVAILABLE WHEN NEEDED
 - --COAST GUARD HELICOPTERS, WHILE NOT SPECIFICALLY DESIGNED FOR EMS. WERE ABLE TO PROVIDE THE SERVICE NEEDED
 - -- COAST GUARD ON THE AVERAGE RESPONDED TO EMS REQUESTS WITHIN 15 TO 20 MINUTES
- III. EMS INLAND MYSSIONS PERFORMED DID NOT INTERFERE WITH PERFORMANCE OF PRIMARY MISSIONS
 - IV. SEVERAL OTHER AGENCIES ALSO PROVIDE HELICOPTERS EMS COVERAGE OF OREGON AND WASHINGTON

 ONE MEDICAL CARE FACILITY TO ANOTHER WHICH IS MORE
 CAPABLE OF TREATING THE PARTICULAR CASE.
- 3. EMERGENCY TRANSPORT OF HUMAN ORGANS FOR TRANSPLANT, BLOOD, MEDICAL SUPPLIES AND EQUIPMENT, OR MEDICAL PERSONNEL.




