Dear Mr. Chairman:

In your March 1, 1979, letter you requested a list of Federal categorical assistance programs which go to State governments. In a discussion with your Committee, we agreed to provide a list of categorical assistance programs for which States are the only eligible applicants, plus the 1978 estimated obligations for the programs. This list is enclosed.

The list is based on the Office of Management and Budget's Catalog of Federal Domestic Assistance, dated November 1978. We used the catalog because it is the only compendium of available Federal assistance. The estimated obligations were also taken from the catalog.

As arranged with your Committee, unless you publicly announce its contents earlier, we plan no further distribution of this letter until 3 days from the date of the letter. At that time, we will make copies available to others upon request.
