P_ Dear Mr. Chairman:

Your July 30, 1974, letter requested fiscal years 1973 and 1974 data on the Office of Education's use of (1) funds to support, conduct, and attend) conferences, seminars, and training sessions attended by a significant number of Office of Education personnel and (2) consultants, experts, (and consulting organizations) in lieu of Federal employees.

At an October 4, 1974, meeting, representatives of your office broadened the scope of the request to include information on all conferences, seminars, and training sessions that, in our judgment, were attended by a significant number of personnel from the Department of Health, Education, and Welfare's Education Division, which includes the Office of Education, the National Institute of Education, and the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Education. They also asked us to obtain this information on Office of the Secretary personnel whose duties related directly to Education Division programs and to determine the total number of staff-days that all of the foregoing personnel spent attending these conferences, seminars, and training sessions.

At a May 19, 1975, meeting, representatives of your office requested that the information on the Office of Education's use of consultants, experts, and consulting organizations in lieu of Federal employees be provided in a subsequent report so that additional information in this area could be included.

We interviewed Department officials, reviewed Department regulations, and examined travel and other records of the Office of Education, the National Institute of Education, the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Education, and the Office of the Secretary.

CONFERENCES, SEMINARS, AND TRAINING SESSIONS

We obtained information on (1) headquarters-funded travel and related costs of conferences and seminars attended by Education Division and Office of the Secretary personnel on matters relating directly to Education Division programs, (2) certain conferences supported by the Education Division, and (3) training sessions attended by Education Division headquarters personnel.

We did not determine to what extent (1) the Office of Education awarded contracts and grants specifically for organizing and conducting conferences and seminars or (2) Office of Education contractors and grantees conducted conferences and seminars as part of a broader purpose project. The Office of Education's computerized management information system could not provide this information, and accumulating such data manually would have required a substantial expenditure of manpower and time.

Conferences and seminars attended by Department personnel

We accumulated data on education conferences and seminars attended by Education Division and Office of the Secretary employees and consultants through an extensive review of fiscal years 1973 and 1974 travel orders and vouchers available at headquarters offices. We did not include staff-days expended or travel costs where only local travel was involved. The following table summarizes the Department staff-days expended and the travel and related costs for these conferences and seminars but does not include salary costs.

More detailed information on conferences and seminars attended by three or more Education Division and Office of the Secretary personnel is provided in enclosures I and II.

Education Division-sponsored conferences

The Office of Education's directive on approving Office-sponsored conferences specifies that all costs be included on the approval form, but complete attendance and cost information on some conferences was not available. According to Office of Education officials, all costs are not necessarily included because in some cases Federal grant or contract funds may be used to pay for travel and related costs of grantee or contractor personnel attending the conferences, yet such costs may not be included on the conference approval forms. In addition, local travel costs were not included and in some cases conference records were incomplete and Office of Education officials were unable to provide the information. The following table summarizes the available information on Office of Education-sponsored conferences.

Of the staff-days shown above, 120 for fiscal year 1973 and 12 for 1974 are also included in the figures for conferences and seminars attended by three or more Department personnel shown in the table on page 3. Also, \$6,723 of the fiscal year 1974 estimated cost duplicates the figure for conferences and seminars attended by three or more Department personnel shown in the table on page 3.

The fiscal year 1973 estimated cost figure exceeds that of the following year because of a \$75,000 conference: Education Fair 1973--A Model Dissemination Workshop, held in May 1973. The Office's conference approval form showed an estimated attendance of 695 non-Office of Education personnel and 25 Office personnel for the 3-day conference. Additional information on Office of Education-sponsored conferences is provided in enclosures III and IV.

The following information pertains to conferences sponsored by the National Institute of Education. Costs shown include only the cost of sponsoring the conferences and do not include travel and related costs for Institute personnel. Seventy-two of the staff days shown for fiscal year 1974 are also included in the figure for conferences and seminars attended by three or more Department personnel in the table on page 3.
