ADDITIONAL VIEWS OF CRITICS AND PROPONENTS

Comments of critics and proponents may be found in various records which are available to the public. These include recent congressional hearings and Corps— and State—sponsored public hearings pertinent to the project. The critics' primary concern is the project's irrevers— ible damage to the natural environment. On the other hand proponents claim such damage would be minimal and that the project would attract new businesses, with an attendant increase in the area's general economy.

We did not ask the Corps to formally comment on this report. We did, however, discuss its contents with Louis-ville District officials.
